Councilman Henry reported that there was a recommendation from the Planning Board to change of zoning of the Club Bene property (Rt. 35 redevelopment Area) from Age Restricted to Market Value. He said that there will be an article in the Suburban newspaper.

- Councilman Buchanan said that repairs are needed to be made to the antiquated public works garage. The question is, do we fix something that is inadequate or do we move ahead and build something that is going to be better for the town and stop spending money on repairs.

Mayor said that this is a financial question.

Councilman Perrette said he and Wayne Kronowski, our CFO will be putting together a chart showing capital expenditures and which ones will be paid off and other new ones going on. He said that you pay a lower rate in the beginning so that is something to watch.

Mayor asked if investing in the old building was a bad investment.

Mr. Kronowski responded that if it takes another 10 years to put the building up you could say that the money would be well spent.

Councilman Perrette stated that there is a safety concern at the building now.

Business Admin. responded to the Mayor, explaining that this was gone over at the budget meeting. The building is on deplorable condition, especially the roof. If we are building a building in three years we need a thin band aid but if we are building a building in 10+ years we need a thicker band aid. He said if the engineer could prepare the specifications, we could decide on what to do and when.

Mayor asked Councilman Bella if he had a problem placing this item on for the next agenda.

Councilman Bella said that he would not.

Mayor asked that he follow-up with Councilman Buchanan and the Engineer over the next few weeks.

Councilman Buchanan said to keep in mind that the building is old and will need new garage doors, gas tanks and a lot of other repairs. If we have a garbage truck in one bay we need to send other repairs out to other public places. He would like to see the smaller band-aid and a push for new facility but lowering the cost of building one.
