At this time Mayor O'Brien opened the meeting to the public or any and all issues. Those appearing were:

Jonathan Gills, 54 Kendall Drive

12 Year old sixth grader at the Middle School
Expressed his concerns about the poor conditions of the soccer fields on
Bordentown Avenue and that on April 13<sup>th</sup> during practice on field 6 his foot got stuck in a whole and fractured his foot.
Mayor stated that the president of the Soccer Association called him and he went out there over the weekend and the Vice-President was showing him around. The Mayor recommended to the council that this issue be reviewed and come back with a recommendation. Councilwoman suggested that it be closed until the council

makes a decision. Mayor asked what the pleasure of the council was.

  - Johathan's mother

- Expressed her disappointment in the maintenance of the soccer fields for the past seven years that they have been playing there. She said that these are Green Acre fields and questioned if the town was responsible for maintaining them. Response by Councilman Buchanan that they provide the material and the organizations provide the man power and if there is something major they let the Parks Division know.

Ms. Erdek said that there are four fields that are practically closed because of the conditions.

Discussion followed regarding the distribution of the money.

Mayor suggested they put together a five (5) year plan going forward with the CFO and the Business Administrator on how to financially put together this plan with the executive board of the soccer association.

Councilman Buchanan stated that there is money in the budget every year for the up-grade of all fields as necessary. So we can have the Director of Recreation and Parks Department review the immediate needs now.

Councilwoman Novak said in Carteret all but one of their Soccer Fields are artificial turf. Which were obtained through the grant process. She said that she has been on line and that there are many grants out there and that is one of the reasons that the Borough should have a grant writer due to the overwhelming paperwork involved in applying for grants.

Mayor said that there are pros and cons to artificial turf, some people like it some do not and that there is also a drainage issue there. Mayor asked the engineer if there was a cost estimate ever put together and what area.

Mr. Cornell stated that in the past they looked at the field closest to the concession and that typically you are looking at a cost of \$700,000-\$1,000,000. depending on what you provide.

Councilman Buchanan asked if we would be able to go through the County and their Share Program. He responded that would be a possibility. The Mayor elaborated on what some of the grant programs are about such as the matching programs and what that meant to the borough.

Ms. Erdek said that the soccer association does not get any money from the borough. Mr. Kronowski said that it was his understanding that we reimburse the organizations for officials, there is some equipment provided, field lighting is provided.

Councilman McGill asked that the borough engineer go out to the field and get a first hand look and report back to the council.

Mayor asked if there were any other questions or comments.

None made.

Councilwoman Novak made a motion to close the public portion. Seconded by Councilman Buchanan.
