At this time the Mayor opened the meeting for questions or comments on any and all matters.

Those appearing were:

- Phil Emma, 16 Cori Street

Commented on recreational marijuana. He felt that Sayreville should get out in front of this issue and asked for Sayreville pass a Resolution prohibiting recreational use of marijuana in Sayreville and an Ordinance changing our land development code and making this a prohibited use. He stated that our town has the responsibility to protect its residents. He also mentioned that other municipalities have adopted bans on this matter.

Council President Kilpatrick said that about one month ago we received a copy of the ordinance adopted by Old Bridge and had asked that we take a hard look at it and consider having an ordinance adopted. Councilman Lembo and Councilwoman Novak agreed and asked the attorney to check out other Municipalities ordinances or resolutions.

Mr. DuPont said that he will get a copy of the ordinance and sit and discuss with the Business Admin.

Councilwoman Novak asked if we could also have a resolution prepared to the State telling them how much we are opposed to this.

- Ken Olchaskey, 108 North Edward St.

Commented and said he is pleased that the public address system is so much better. You can hear in the back of the room now. Councilman Melendez stated that there was some manual audio changes. He said that he also had a few vendors come in and do an assessment of our system and problem. He said that part of the problem was found that there is some legacy equipment, the audio processor that takes the audio from your mic and digitizes it so we can send it through cablevision, so that is why U-Tube works better than the cable provider and at the same time there is going to be a new microphone.

- Jim Robinson, 11 Borelle Square

Questioned what could be told about the Fulton's Landing Consent Order.

Mr. DuPont responded that it was just a continuation of the Mediation.

Questioned if the Attorney was familiar with the injunction filed by the Bay Keepers and Edison Wetlands.

Mr. DuPont said that he was not familiar with that matter. Mayor said that he had commented on it based upon a call from a reporter.

He then questioned about someone being authorized and directed to act on the Resolution that was passed that had to do with the COAH Settlement. The Borough Attorney stated that the Mayor had announced that he was not going to execute any document associated with the COAH litigation, so therefore the Council authorized the Business Admin. or Council President be authorized to execute those documents.

He then questioned that if the council had not done that would all of the work that had gone into the negotiations and settlement not have been implemented.

Mr. DuPont said, that was the argument that would have been levied against the Borough if it wasn't executed by the Borough.

Council President Kilpatrick said that if River Road project units are not realized we would then end up with all of those other market rate units that would have to be built.

Mr. Robinson then asked the Mayor if there was a particular reason why he did not sign.

Mayor felt he was being political and did not respond.

Mr. Robinson thanked the Council.

Asked the Council if they could give him an update on the Zoning Board and the drug rehab facility.

Mayor recognized Mr. Emma who sits on the Zoning Board if he could come up and comment.

Mr. Emma came forward and said that the Zoning Board had denied the application and it being appealed before a Federal Judge and it is still in litigation. The Borough Attorney interjected and suggested that in abundance of caution no comments be made on pending litigation.
