BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sayreville, in the county of Middlesex, that the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Sayreville are hereby amended as follows:

I. Adoption of standards by reference.

A. <u>Property Maintenance Code</u>. The *Current* International Property Maintenance Code 2006, together with all amendments, supplements, revisions and updates, as the same are approved and published every three years by the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc., be and it is hereby adopted as the Property Maintenance Code of the Borough of Sayreville in the State of New Jersey for the control of all buildings and structures, both residential and commercial, and industrial which are located within the Borough of Sayreville, and a copy of the International Property Maintenance Code 2006 shall be on file in the Department of Code Enforcement and Zoning of the Borough of Sayreville.

V. Fees

D. For a resale property that is in such disrepair, that Code Compliance cannot be obtained. At the discretion of the Director of Code Enforcement and Zoning an "AS IS" letter can be obtained in lieu of the certificate of resale compliance. Conditions of the "AS IS" letter must be within thirty (30) days of the closing. Failure to meet these conditions within thirty (30) days can result in a court appearance and the issuance of a \$1,250.00 penalty. The fee for an "AS IS" letter be \$500.00.

D. *E.* All said fees shall be paid with the application for inspection and/or with the request for re-inspection. The fee for the fire inspection shall be that which is

established in the Uniform Fire Safety Act set forth in said Act and the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Sayreville.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Sayreville, in the County of Middlesex, that **Chapter Twelve - Building and Housing**, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Sayreville, shall also be amended to reflect said change.

ORDINANCE #380-17

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SAYREVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING A SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53 TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PREPARATION OF AN APPROVED TAX MAP; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL EMERGENCY NOTES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$350,000 TO FUND THE SPECIAL EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER <u>DETAILS OF SAID ISSUE</u>

WHEREAS, it has been found necessary to make a special emergency appropriation in the amount of \$350,000 to meet certain expenses incurred or to be incurred as a result of the need for the preparation of an approved tax map in the Borough of Sayreville, in the County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"), and no adequate provision was made in the 2017 budget for the aforesaid purpose; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55 provides that it shall be lawful to make such appropriation, which appropriation shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of an appropriation of at least one-fifth of the amount authorized pursuant hereto; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55 authorizes the Borough to issue special emergency notes in order to fund a special emergency appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the Borough hereby desires to make a special emergency appropriation and to authorize special emergency notes in order to fund such appropriation;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED (by not less than two-thirds of the full membership of the governing body affirmatively concurring) as follows:

Section 1.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53, a special emergency exists as a result of the need for the preparation of an approved tax map for the Borough and a special emergency appropriation is hereby made in the amount of \$350,000 for said purpose. The \$350,000 appropriated herein is sufficient to fund the special emergency.

Section 2.

The special emergency appropriation set forth in Section 1 hereof shall be provided for in the budgets of the succeeding years by the inclusion of not less than \$70,000 annually in each of the next five years' succeeding budgets.

Section 3. Special Emergency Notes (the "Notes") in an amount of \$350,000 are hereby authorized to be issued. The Notes shall be issued in one series and shall be in such denomination or denominations, shall bear such number or numbers, such date or dates of issue and maturity, and such rate or rates of interest, as may be determined in the manner and in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Local Budget Law, constituting Chapter 4 of Title 40A of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey (the "Local Budget Law"). The Notes shall be entitled "Special Emergency Notes, Series 2017" or any other designation determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (the "Chief Financial Officer").

Section 4.

All of the Notes shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor of the Borough and the Chief Financial Officer and the corporate seal of The Borough shall be affixed thereto, attested by the manual signature of the Clerk of the Borough, and shall be payable, both as to principal and interest, to the purchaser thereof, and shall be in substantially the form as attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and made a part hereof.

Section 5.

The Chief Financial Officer be and he hereby is authorized and directed to determine all matters in connection with the Notes not determined by this ordinance or a subsequent ordinance or resolution and his signature upon the Notes shall be conclusive as to such determinations.

Section 6.

The Chief Financial Officer be and he hereby is authorized to take all actions necessary to sell the Notes at public or private sale in such amounts as he may determine at not less than par and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof and payment therefor.

Section 7. That any instrument issued pursuant hereto shall be a general obligation of the Borough, and the Borough's full faith and credit are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said obligations and, unless otherwise paid or payment provided for, an amount sufficient for such payment shall be inserted in the budget and a tax sufficient to provide for the payment thereof shall be levied and collected.

Section 8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to report in writing to the Borough Council at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant hereto is made, such report to include the principal amount, description, interest rate and maturity of the Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 9.

The Mayor of the Borough, the Chief Financial Officer and the Clerk of the Borough are hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary for the sale and delivery of the Notes.

Section 10.

The Borough intends to issue the Notes in order to finance the cost of the special emergency appropriation for the purposes of providing funds for the preparation of an approved tax map. The Borough expects that the maximum principal amount of notes which will be issued to finance such costs is \$350,000. If the Borough incurs any such costs prior to the issuance of the Notes, the Borough intends to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of the Notes.

Section 11.

The Notes may be renewed from time, but at least 1/5 of such Notes, and the renewals thereof, shall mature and be paid in each year so that all Notes and renewals shall have matured and have been paid not later than the last day of the fifth year following the date of the adoption hereof.

Section 12.

Two certified copies of this ordinance shall be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 13. This ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.

Michael DuPont stated that for the record that upon review regarding the five minute rule on the public speaking during the public portion that he does not seem to find that rule or ordinance.

Clerk Farbaniec indicated that there is an ordinance and it is also contained in the Council's Rules of Order. Mr. DuPont stated that inasmuch as it has been verified the five minute rule can be applied so that everyone from the public has an opportunity to speak and the meeting is run in an efficient manner.

1) Questioned if the proformer of estimated costs for COAH has been calculated to cost the taxpayers of this town.

2) Asked if the Chairman of the Planning Board could come to a meeting and present what took place at their meeting and advise the governing body and public what their plans were for the rest of the year for transparency.

3) Asked how many homes were approved as well as affordable but not built as in the language in Ord. 364-17 and what we have lost out on over the past 10 years.

Mayor O'Brien deferred the questions to Councilman Lembo.

Councilman Lembo stated that during the upcoming Planning Board session he would go over his issues but at the last Planning Board meeting which was very short there was only one letter to the Mayor and Council which he will be reading into record during his report.

Mr. Leoncavallo addressed the Proformer question, which he stated that he does not have the Order signed from the Judge yet. Mr. DuPont indicated that that Order had been signed. Mr. Leoncavallo then addressed the 10 year lookback. He said that after talking with the Tax assessor it cannot be done by looking at the aggregate. Someone would have to look at each individual line item.

Mayor asked if he could have these figures ready for the next meeting.

Mr. Melanaski asked if it could be put on the next agenda. Mayor said he would have it on Admin. & Finance Report.

At the last meeting he asked if Gillette Manor was included in the COAH Count.

Mr. Leoncavallo said that he did not have the opportunity as he has other report to provide to the Mayor and Council.

Mr. Robinson felt this would be relevant if the borough opts to appeal the Judge's decision. Mayor asked that the Borough Engineer work in tandem with the Planner and forward the information to the council, borough attorney and business administrator prior to the next meeting.

Asked for an update on the National Lead Intervenor status and what the appeal process was. Mr. DuPont indicated that no further action has taken place as of this day and that the appeal process deadline is 45 days from that date of the entry signed of the Order.

Questioned the version of 366-B17 was actually referred to in the Court Order. Councilwoman Novak said that it was the higher density ordinance with just the Camelot I and Camelot II sites.

Questioned what the Builders Immunity was. Responded to by the Borough Attorney.

Questioned the status of the National Lead/Cross Avenue site being included for Open Space and have we received any Appraisals on the property.

Councilwoman Novak stated the topic is on the Agenda Session tonight.

Questioned the grant applications for Open Space Grants. Council President Buchanan said that he has not heard anything yet.
