Borough Engineer David Samuel reported that it has been a long negotiation and we are finally beginning to conclude the transaction. He stated that the Duhernal water system has 1,000 acres of land, 25 wells, 59,000' of water main, diversion rights for up to a maximum of 18.3 mgd on a peak day and an annual diversion of 12 mgd. This is going to through and secure Sayreville's water rights for the extended future.

Back in 1994 we bought the first 1/3 interest and it was the intention then to go through and conclude the total purchase but duPont and Hercules were much larger water users back then. This purchase negotiation has been going on for over four years.

Mayor asked if there were any questions or comments of the governing body. There were none made. He then asked if there were any questions or comments from the public and there were none made. He called for a motion.

Councilman Lembo moved the public hearing be closed and the Ordinance be adopted on second and final reading and advertised according to law. Motion was seconded by Councilman Buchanan.

WHEREAS, both Hercules and du Pont have each agreed, pursuant to separate purchase and sale agreements, to sell their respective interest in Duhernal to the Borough; and
