To all concerned, I would like to introduce myself. My name is George Gawron-Superintendent of Public Works and Stormwater Coordinator.

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has performed an audit on the Borough of Sayreville and has found that we have not been in full compliance.

You are receiving this letter because all entities that were stated above must comply with the rules and regulations of the Borough of Sayreville's MS4 permit and NJDEP. It has been several years that our town has been delinquent in having all the entities as stated above comply with our MS4 permit.

All entities as stated above must comply and send the Borough of Sayreville Department of Public Works their annual reports by February 28 of each year. Failure to comply will result in fines. Fines can be up to \$1,000.00 a month and will accrue until all paperwork has been completed and filed with the Borough of Sayreville Department of Public Works.

Compliance for the Borough of Sayreville's MS4 Permit

- Training
- Outfall inspection- 20% each year
- Outfall pipe mapping
- Scoring- inspection
- Illicit discharge
- Street sweeping logs with measurements in cubic yards.
- Storm drain labeling
- Storm drain basin repairs
- Retention pond maintenance
- Grass swale maintenance
- Private salt dome on property
